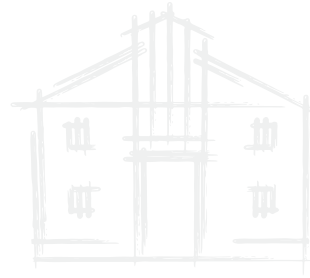

VINEYARD

Our wines are exclusively sourced from our estate vineyard in the Livermore Valley. The Grenache and Counoise were grown in our Hayes vineyard located on the southwest portion of our estate. This vineyard has the widest elevation range (560-860 feet) on our estate. Of the 20 grape varieties we grow, 11 of them are grown on the Hayes vineyard because it features the largest array of soils, aspects and slopes. The Mourvedre was grown in our Raboli vineyard, which features an elevation range of 615-650 feet above sea level. We farm all of these varieties for Rosé to ensure optimal flavor and fruit expression.

WINEMAKING

FERMENTATION | All varieties were hand-picked in the early morning hours, brought to the winery and gently whole cluster pressed. Each varietal was cold-fermented separately to retain the natural fruit esters and flavors of the grapes.

AGING | The wine was racked after primary fermentation and the varieties were aged in their distinct pieces for about a month. After the final blend was made, the wine was transferred into a blend tank and aged for about one month in stainless steel tanks prior to bottling.

HARVEST

All of these varieties were picked in October 2018. The 2018 vintage was moderate to warm in the Livermore Valley, without any heat spikes. This allowed the fruit to get extra hang time on the vine, which brought out the fruit and floral qualities even more. Overall, we saw good yields, healthy fermentations and high quality wines.

ROBBIE'S TASTING NOTES

This wine displays a vibrant peach color with aromas of wild strawberries, gardenias and white nectarine. On the palate, bright acidity and flavors of fresh stone fruit and berries are highlighted in this well-balanced, opulent wine. Enjoy through 2020.
